Celebrating *Maine's Role in American Art*, the Farnsworth Art Museum offers a nationally recognized collection of works from many of America's greatest artists. With 20,000 square feet of gallery space and over 10,000 works in the collection, there is always something new on view at the Farnsworth. The museum houses the nation's second-largest collection of works by premier 20th-century sculptor Louise Nevelson. Its Wyeth Center exclusively features works of Andrew, N.C., and Jamie Wyeth.

The Farnsworth library is also housed in the museum's Rockland, ME campus. Two historic buildings, the Farnsworth Homestead and the Olson House, complete the museum complex.

Nightingale

performed by Figures of Speech Theatre

Nightingale is Figure of Speech Theatre's exotic, musical adaptation of the Hans Christian Andersen story of the Emperor who is moved by the song of a plain gray bird until he receives the gift of a jeweled mechanical bird with which he becomes obsessed. The production gently stresses the importance of connection with Nature, and with the true essences of life. *Nightingale* enjoyed a successful Broadway run at the New Victory Theater, and is also a UNIMA Citation of Excellence winner (1996).
